Camper and Parent Contract Agreement

1. Being in a Norwich Family YMCA camp program is a privilege. Every child is expected to learn and to live by the rules. If a child’s behavior is not appropriate to the YMCA or camp setting, or is destructive to the facility and equipment, or is disrespectful to the staff, the parent may be asked to make other arrangements for his/her child. The YMCA will not ask a parent/guardian to remove a child without first enlisting his/her help with behavioral issues.

2. The methods in which we deal with CHRONIC unacceptable behavior include both suspension and releasing a child from a program. Suspension will mean that a child may not participate in a program for a specified period of time (1 day to 2 weeks). Releasing a child from a program means the child is no longer allowed to participate in the program.

3. The following are examples of behavior that might cause the YMCA Camp staff to suspend or release a child from a program:
 - Physical violence and aggression against staff or other campers
 - Foul and abusive language
 - Vandalism to property and equipment
 - Disregard for program rules and safety

4. Camper’s rules to remember:
 - Respect yourself
 - Respect others and their property
 - Be helpful to others in this program
 - Always do your personal best
 - Be a good sport
 - Problems are resolved by talking, not fighting

5. Parent’s Obligations:
 - Agree to pay in advance for each day my child attends the Camp Program.
 - Understand that if payment for your child’s day at camp has not been made, the YMCA may refuse to let your child stay in the program on that day.
