

Coach Daphne Thompson has finished her 25h season as a collegiate head coach and tenth at SUNY Oneonta. Where she has 176 total wins at Oneonta, bringing her career total to 399 wins during her coaching career.



Prior to Oneonta, Thompson spent 15 seasons as the head coach at Hartwick College. In 1999 Thompson was the WBCA District II Coach of the Year, Women 's Division III Coach of the Year by the Basketball Coaches Association of New York, NYSWCAA Coach of the Year, and Empire Athletic Association Co-Coach of the

year after leading the Hawks to an NCAA appearance.



A native of Morris, NY Coach Thompson is a graduate of the University of Delaware, where she was a four year varsity player for the Division I Blue Hens and a team captain her senior year. Thompson appeared in 107 games at Delaware as a forward on a team where they won over 60% of their games while capturing two East Coast Conference Championships.




After graduating from Delaware with a degree in Physical Education, Thompson spent time abroad with the United States East Coast All Star basketball team that traveled and competed

in France. Thompson, returned to her alma mater as a graduate assistant in 1990 where she was heavily involved with the practices, recruiting, analyzing videotape of individual and team performances. During this tenure Coach Thompson received her Masters Degree in Physical Education with an emphasis in Athletic Training. Thompson is a National Athletic Trainers Association certified athletic trainer.



Prior to college Coach Thompson was a celebrated scholastic performer on the court at Morris Central School where she finished her five year varsity career with more than 1500 points and 1000 rebounds for the Mustangs. As a senior, The Daily Star of Oneon-





Keith Thompson was a multi sport athlete in college, as he competed both on the baseball diamond and the hard court for SUNY Delhi and also Hartwick College. Coach Thompson was a member of the 1988 Hartwick College basketball team that won the Eastern Regional Championship and advanced to the NCAA Division III Final Four. Coach Keith Thompsons coaching experience included eight years as an assistant coach at Oneonta State along with ten years as an assistant at Hartwick College. Thompson also served as head coach at Morris High School for three years.

Thompson earned a degree in Elementary Education from Oneonta State in 1999 with Cum Laude honors and went on to earn his masters degree from the University of New England in 2004. Coach Thompson is a familiar face in Chenango County as he is currently employed by the Sherburne Earlville School District as an Elementary Science teacher.

During the winter of 2012, Coach Thompson was inducted into the Section 4 Athletic Hall of Fame for his athletic accomplishments while attending Cherry Valley-Springfield Central Schools.

Keith and his wife Daphne also volunteer their time coaching Spring Basketball with the Catskill Mountain AAU Girls program.
